8 Weeks: Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia (FVR-CP) (1/3)

Feline Leukemia Test (FeLV)

Deworming

Fecal Examination

12 Weeks: Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia (FVR-CP) (2/3)

+/- Feline Leukemia (FeLV)

16 Weeks: Feline Viral Rhinotracheitis, Calicivirus, Panleukopenia (FVR-CP) (3/3)

+/- Feline Leukemia (FeLV)

Rabies (1 Year)

Fecal Examination

5 Months: Females are Spayed, Males Neutered

+/- Microchip Placement

6 Months: Feline Leukemia and Feline Immunodeficiency Virus Test (FeLV/FIV)

Important Guidelines

- At least 2 FVR-CP vaccines are necessary the first year, followed by boosters 1 and 2 years later.
- A physical exam, Rabies vaccine, Feline Leukemia vaccine, and fecal exam are done yearly, and the FVR-CP is done every 3 years.
- Feline Leukemia virus vaccines are recommended for all cats who go outside or come in contact with lots of cats (cat shows, catteries, etc.).
- Regardless of outdoor status, the Feline Leukemia series is recommended for all kittens with a 1 year booster.
- We do not recommend the FIP vaccine at this time.
- There is now a 3 year Rabies vaccine available, but it does contain an adjuvant.
- There is now heartworm prevention for cats. Please ask us about it.
